HARC Dues Payment - Options & how-to

This is just a notice to let you know that we -- thanks to Jim Guilford and Al Prosser -- now have a very simple method of paying HARC dues by electronic money transfer from a bank account to HARC. So far, two our our members have used this method without any difficulty. I have outlined the process in detail on the HARC website; here it is:

Registration Process - Any one of the following will work:

- (1) Simply print out our PDF membership form, then mail it with appropriate payment to our postal address.
- (2)Simply print out our PDF membership form, fill it in and then either scan it or take a photo of it and then e-mail the scanned .pdf file or .jpg photo it to Howard (VE1DHD) at: dhdickson@eastlink.ca indicating that you will be paying by electronic money transfer from your bank. The process is as follows:

Procedure for Paying HARC Membership Dues by electronic money transfer:

Since fewer and fewer of our members use cheques, it is becoming more difficult for some to pay their HARC dues, requiring that they come to a meeting and pay with cash. That is fine for some but for others who are for what ever reason unable to attend meetings it is a problem.

However, we now have a system set up to allow HARC members to pay their 2016 membership dues using electronic money transfer. The procedure to use is as follows:

a) Send an email to Howard VE1DHD, our Membership Chair, at dhdickson@eastlink.ca

and cc: Jim Guilford, our Treasurer, at jimguilford@gmail.com

with either a scanned copy or photo image of your 2016 Membership Application Form; or, if there are no changes, simply email Howard and Jim with your full name and callsign saying no changes; ALSO indicate that you are paying by e-money transfer.

- b) Go to your on-line banking site and send an e-money transfer to our Treasurer (Jim Guilford) jimguilford@gmail.com. Be sure to include in that email the security question that Jim will need to then make an electronic transfer into our HARC bank account.
- c) Once Jim receives the money and has deposited it to the HARC account, he will confirm with you and he will cc: to Howard.
- d) Howard will then issue a 2016 e-Membership Card by email confirming that your 2016 membership has been paid.
- (3) Alternatively, you can come to one of our monthly club meetings and Howard (VE1DHD) our Membership Chair will be happy to renew your membership.

This means that our members can now pay in one of three ways:

- 1) cash at the door
- 2) cheque
- 3) e-transfer

The last full rip of the Cascadia earthquake fault happened on Jan. 27, 1700. They have taken that event and modeled it, see Tsunami Forecast Model Animation: Cascadia 1700. You can watch it to see how the waves spread and then reverberate across the Pacific Ocean. With the Cascadia Earthquake Exercise (U.S.) coming up in June, there will be much more interest in this earthquake fault system and the potential impacts to our North American coasts and indeed the Pacific Basin.

We only know the date for this earthquake due to the record keeping done in Japan when they recorded an orphan tsunami that did not have a local earthquake associated with it. This was then also tied to tree ring dating done on the Pacific Northwest coast where trees were killed when saltwater inundated the land they were on as it subsided.

Safety Note GOOD VISION IN A DOWNPOUR

How to achieve good vision while driving during a heavy downpour.

We are not sure why it is so effective; just try this method when it rains heavily. This method was given me by a Police friend who had experienced and confirmed it. It is useful....even driving at night. One method used by Canadian Military Drivers for years.

Most of the motorists would turn on HIGH or FASTEST SPEED of the wipers during heavy downpour, yet the visibility in front of the windshield is still bad......

In the event you face such a situation, just try your SUN GLASSES (any model will sudden, your visibility in front of your windshield is perfectly clear, as if there is no rain.

Make sure you always have a pair of SUN GLASSES in your car, as you are not only helping yourself to drive safely with good vision, but also might save your friend's life by giving him this idea..

Try it yourself and share it with your friends! Amazing, you still see the drops on the windshield, but not the sheet of rain falling.

You can see where the rain bounces off the road. It works to eliminate the "blindness" from passing semi's spraying you too.

Or the "kickup" if you are following a semi or car in the rain. They ought to teach that little tip in driver's training. It really does work.



What Is That Noise or Signal I'm Hearing....

A recent link posted on the ON4KST 2200/630m chat page brought up a very helpful web site.

The Sigidwiki site

(http://www.sigidwiki.com/wiki/ Signal_Identification_Guide) lists examples of the various transmission modes being used from LF to UHF, along with examples of what these signals look like on a waterfall display.

With the proliferation of digital modes found on-the-air today, it's often fairly baffling, trying to figure out what you are hearing. The main database page

http://www.sigidwiki.com/wiki/ Database

contains a staggering 272 different identified modes of transmitting information, in one way or another ... no wonder it's hard to keep track!

Clicking on any of the modes will bring up more details about the mode, sometimes with links to the decoding software and further reading.

I'm sure there are more that aren't on the list (is WSPR there or did I just miss it?) but it's still an impressive and helpful collection for those that use a waterfall display on their receivers.

Please let's all show our best Ham Spirit over the next three days so that everyone has a chance to work VP8SGI.

On Sunday, we will be seeking ATNO contacts on 17 meters SSB. We will QRT on Monday morning. Best wishes from the Intrepid-DX Group VP8 Team."

At this point, I want to remind everybody that VP8 team members left their homes past January 7th, and they expect to be back at home around February 22th. More than 45 days out of home, working and risking their lives in one of the hardest places of the World, trying to give us three new DXCC countries, two of them in the highest part on the most wanted list, in a project that exceeds \$215.000. So please, lets help them to reach their aim following operator instructions and respecting other callers.

Payment Options ... In addition to mailing a cheque to the Club mailing address along with the application form, or paying at the February Club meeting, we have set up a new electronic money transfer process as outlined below:

Procedure for Paying HARC Membership Dues by electronic money transfer:

Since fewer and fewer of our members use cheques, it is becoming more difficult for some to pay their HARC dues, requiring that they come to a meeting and pay with cash.
