Basic Amateur Radio Licence Course - Coordinator

It has been a rewarding and enjoyable endeavor to be the coordinator of the basic course for the past four years. I have assisted the previous coordinator during my first year when I was groomed to take over the next year. One of the biggest pleasures in ham radio is assisting new operators in obtaining their callsign. One gives back some of the learning and experience that they have accumulated over the years even though not all the info given may be of a technical nature. Students learn the protocol and etiquette in accordance with the regulations stipulated by Industry Canada needed to be a good professional operator in their chosen mode and area of interest. The process of "giving back" and sharing your enjoyment is never easily forgotten. I personally have enjoyed working with the dedicated instructors and students over the past five years. Our course can be improved and managed by anyone willing to give a little bit of their time to keeping the momentum roll-

The following is a generalized list of the duties that are needed at the discretion of the new coordinator:

1. Order ten to twelve new Basic Amateur Radio License manuals (brown version only) from Durham Radio or RAC. Some of the students taking the course already have old copies of the soft covered text and there is always interest throughout the year for self-study individuals who study and take the course on

their own who purchase books.

- 2. Determine the start date at the end of September and end date of the course in December to fit in the required thirteen lessons and the multiple choice exam. Ensure that the dates are submitted and published on the club website in the spring on early summer. Communicate early with the website manager. Ensure the full Saturday courses are emphasized and cc station manager. Get hardcopies of the class topics and dates for inclusion to students
- 3. E-mail all instructors and examiners in August asking for their attendance and notifying them of their scheduled topic and date to be delivered. Assist the instructor with any a/v equipment, handouts, quizzes or demonstration material. Have the classroom ready and open to receive.
- 4. Prepare ten to twelve portfolio jackdaws containing student names, HARC registration materiel, course schedule and outline of the topics to be covered and name of the instructor. Prepare a list of required online resources: Downloadable ExHaminer written by VE2AAY, other resources such as the online Emergency Radio course presented by the Toronto ARES. Hardcopy of the HARC Reflector.
- 5. Advertise in early July for new students and maintain a list of prospective students from the past year who have shown interest in taking any up coming licensing courses

presented by the club. Sources for prospective students: Recommendation by previous students who have completed the course, by all club members, referrals from previous ham members in their family or friends, enquiries and visitors to the club station, Shearwater Hobby Show, Downeast Flea Market, NSCC electronic and IT courses, local ground SAR organizations.

- **6.** Prepare a Public Service Bulletin "PSAs" for Information Radio CBC, Seaside FM, and public Community announcements on community TV station. (Early September)
- 7. Give a notice to the Nova Scotia Yachting Association with a picture and promotional announcement as to the benefit of an Amateur radio license for sailors and mariners for submission to all the yacht clubs.
- 8. Setup a registration process, issuing receipts, information slips and passing out manuals and course materials on the second last Thursday of September. Ensure that you can read names, phone numbers and email addresses. Arrange for an Introduction to the various aspects of Amateur Radio. Explain the process of writing the IC exam and completing the required paperwork to apply for a callsign.
- 9. Take a general attendance to monitor who needs support on various topics and review.

Procedure for loan of Club Equipment

This is an addition to Policy 13.0 printed in Constitution.

If two or more individuals / groups request the same equipment for the same time frame (such as for a repetitive annual event) the following guidelines will be used:

- A. The equipment cannot be requested after 60 days prior to the start of an Annual or Reoccurring Event.
- B. The equipment must be returned within 15 days of the end of the event.
- C. The intent is to allow groups to have equal access to equipment, eg. If group A had the gear the previous year then group B would have precedence if requesting the same gear. If more than 2 groups request the use of the same gear then the group that has not had the gear before or in the previous 2 years would have precedence. In the case of multiple pieces of similar gear being requested by two or more groups the Club Executive will attempt an equitable division if the groups cannot agree among themselves. Groups will always have precedence over an individual for equipment requested for the same period.
- D. The Executive will make a decision on loan within 15 days of the 60 day cutoff date.
- E. If a request comes in after the 60 day time period for a stand alone event, the EXEC will make a decision based on original criteria.

New transatlantic 144MHz beacon GB3WGI

On the 18th of May, 2012, Ofcom issued a NoV for another propagation beacon to test the possibility of a 144MHz transatlantic path from the UK

Located at Lough Navar Forest in Co Fermanagh, Northern Ireland OSI 06599 57718, 349m asl level with a clear take off over the sea, GB3WGI ("West GI" will radiate on 144.487MHz towards North America, initially with an ERP of 100 Watts relative to a dipole, with plans to increase this if licensing allows.

This beacon was made possible due to the generous donation of a transmitter by Brian Justin, WA1ZMS, the man behind the US 70MHz beacon, and NoV holder, Gordon Curry GI6ATZ who is providing the site and site services.

This NoV is particularly welcome from Ofcom in what is clearly a busy Olympic year, and the VHF weak signal community in the US and the UK thank them for their efforts.

No date is yet fixed for the installation of the beacon, but plans are well under way and an announcement will be made in due course



Scouts and Scouters can earn the new Morse code interpreter strip by completing all three requirements: Carrying on a five minute conversation in Morse code at a speed of at least five words per minute, correctly copying a two minute message sent in Morse code at a minimum of five words per minute (copying means writing the message down as it is received) and sending a 25 word written document in Morse code at a minimum of five words per minute.

For many years, Boy Scouts and Scouters have been able to earn an interpreter strip to wear on their uniforms. This strip -- worn on the uniform above the right pocket -- denotes proficiency in a foreign language or sign language. Each language has its own strip (with the name of the language embroidered in that language), and some Scouts and Scouters wear more than one strip. Now those hams involved with the Boy Scouts can show their proficiency in Morse code with a Morse code interpreter strip (with M-O-R-S-E spelled out in Morse code).
