

Hello and a belated Happy New Year to all of our members. This year promises to be a great year for the club with a lot of our normal activities taking place such as the flee market, field day, the ms walk a thon and bike a thon, the museum ships weekend, two car rallies, and of course our exciting work at The Museum of the Atlantic.

This year we have created a TECNICAL TEAM lead by Don Trotter-ve1dtr and at least 7 other club members participating in various projects. Don will provide an update each month in this paper. The team will meet the first Tuesday of the month via a conference call to start. This team of experts will put our club in the fore front of amateur radio. Anyone having an idea for the club that we can look into that will enhance our operation is welcome. We will evaluate each idea and the affects it will have on the club and its members. I believe there are currently 18 projects being undertaken by this new committee and each one is being tracked as to owner and completion date with a status report each month or sooner. A lot of good work going on here..

This past year has seen our volunteers pass out over 7500 certificates to young and old alike, both local and tourists from cruise ships. There were over 200 cruise ships in port this past summer and more expected for this coming summer of 2020. We are currently looking for 2 people to lead our membership for the Flea Market and FIELD DAY. This is a good oppurtunity for our new hams to take on a project and get experience.

Both events are very important to the club . The Flee market venue has been reserved but needs leadership to put on the event. I know there are people out there to help but the co-ordinator is very important to putting it all together. Field Day is always a challange and once again we need that leadership to pull it together. Last year we came first in Canada in our class and 4^{th} in North America.

Field Day this year has 2 possible locations and we must evaluate each location for the logistics of establishing a field day operation. One location is the Citadel Hill and the other is York Redoubt at the mouth of Halifax harbour. Now ,we have been at York Redoubt before and know its limitations but the Citadel needs to be very carefully evaluated for rf noise: access: parking: antenna positions: public access and so on. The co-ordinator will have a team behind him /her to make this happen as many of us has done this position before and help is readily available.. PLEASE consider each of these positions and let the executive know which event you would like to take on.

HATS will have a place each month in this paper so keep posted on what is happening here. We have 43 members in this group who can be called upon to respond in the case of an emergency. Each of these people will need to spend time at the club one Tuesday of the month learning procedures for Exercise Handshake. A schedule will be developed and published so you will know when it is your turn. This is very important to the HARC and EMO. TRAINING COURSES on various equipment will also be made available to HARC and JEM people. Gary MURPHY is the new Co-ordinator and is backed up by Scott-VE1QD.

- 1. Welcome to the HARC monthly meeting for November 2019: The meeting was called to order by President VE1MR Bill at 1922 hours.
- 2. Acceptance of the Agenda: A motion was made to accept the agenda by VE1QD Scott, seconded by VE1AI Dick, the motion passed.
- 3. <u>Roll Call</u>: 24 members and visitors were in attendance.
- 4. Report of any Silent Keys: Nov 1 John Lutes of Lower Sackville VE1CZN
- 5. <u>Approval of Minutes of 19</u> <u>October 2019</u> as printed in the Reflector: A motion was made by VE1DTR Don, seconded by Doug VE1LDL, motion carried.
- 6. President's Report: We will be looking for someone to organize a HAM breakfast in February or march. This is the time of year to look forward to the coming year and the activities that usually take place and we do need coordinators for the Flea Market, Field Day, the MS Walk, The MS Bike Tour, and the Ledwidge Lookoff Rally. Consider organizing or taking part in these activities. Depending on interest, there will likely be a Basic Amateur Radio course in the new year. We hope to have a work party at Cowie Hill to pull in some new coaxial cables between the repeater building and the tower. There will also be climbers and ground crew needed to replace and add antennas to the tower. At least 2 antennas likely need replacement and at least 2 or 3 antennas to be added.
- 7. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>: The income from the period of October 1 to

October 31 was in the amount of \$1291.50. Expenses for the same period came to \$804.07 for a net of negative (\$487.43) the closing balance for the year was \$9332.64. A motion was made by VA1ALW Bill to accept the report. VE1WO Fraser seconded the motion, motion carried.


