Jack, VE1ZZ, was a legend in the Ham Radio community for almost 70 years. When he earned his license in 1948 he was the youngest person in Canada to do so. He made friends and contacts from around the world, many of whom visited Head Jeddore to see his extensive communication towers and system. Jack loved to talk "Ham" to anyone with an interest and was always eager to share stories and his vast knowledge on building better "rigs" and making radio contact to difficult regions. He won numerous awards and certificates over the years, was featured in books, magazines & local television on his accomplishments in the Ham Radio world.

I would like to thank the club and executive for the antenna and for the support of VY0ERC, the timing and the price was just right.


I hope this antenna will give us more fun and points on 40 and 80 m during CQ WW SSB this week.



Welcome: Brian opened the AGM at 2043 hrs. and welcomed the 31 voting HARC members who were present.

Acceptance of the Agenda:

Motion: It was moved by Bill (VE1MR) that the agenda for the 2017 AGM be accepted. The motion was seconded by Scott (VE1QD) Unanimously approved by the voting members present.

Appointment of a Secretary for the AGM:

Motion: It was moved by Bill (VE1MR) that Howard Dickson (VE1DHD) be appointed as Secretary for the 2017 AGM. The motion was seconded by Fraser (VE1WO) and unanimously approved by the voting membership present.

Approval of the Minutes of the 2016 AGM:

Motion: It was moved by Bill (VE1MR) that the 2016 AGM minuets be accepted. The motion was seconded by Scott (VE1QD) and unanimously approved by the members present.

Motion: It was moved by Jim (VE1JG) seconded by Don (VE1DTR) that the fiscal year-end financial report as presented by the Treasurer be accepted and it was unanimously approved by the members present.

Treasurer's Presentation of the 2018 Budget: The 2018 budget had been read at the previous two monthly meetings and had been approved by the membership present.

President's Report for 2017: The President gave his year-end report as part of the November monthly meeting and will be published in full in the near future on the HARC website.

Reports of other Directors: There were no reports from any of the other Directors.

Report of the Nominating Committee and Election of the Executive for 2018: Scott (VE1QD) reported as Chair of the Nominating Committee on behalf of its members (Bill, VE1MR, and Dick, VE1AI) that all of Executive and Committee Chairs & Coordinators for 2018 have been filled with the exception of the Membership Chair. Scott reviewed the large number of key positions that must be filled annually to keep the Club functioning at the high level that we have come to expect.

Subject: Answer re Traffic safety act

Hi Craig,

I spoke to the gentleman who is in charge of the Provincial Traffic Safety Act, Kevin Mitchell Director of Road Safety (Registrar) at TIR.

You will see they are still working on the act and the specific wording. If you feel amateur radio needs to be clarified in the act I would suggest that someone contact Kevin for clarity on how that may look in the future. Kevin's email is

Here is what he quoted me regarding the question you had;

183 Subsection (1) No person shall drive a vehicle or other conveyance on a highway while the vehicle or other conveyance is in motion and the person is using, holding or manipulating:

- a) a hand-held communication device
- b) a hand-held entertainment device; or c) any other prescribed electronic device.
- (2) Subsection (1) does not apply to a person;
- a) using a hand-held communication device in hands-free mode without holding it;
- b) using a hand-held communication device to contact ambulance, law enforcement or fire department

emergency services in relation to an immediate emergency;

- c) using a hand-held communication device in the course of performing the person's duties as the driver of an emergency vehicle; or
- d) prescribed by the regulations.

Obviously emergency vehicles are defined, but we also have our own department and other non emergency entities using TMR, so as we get into writing the regulations we'll further define that as per section 2(d) "prescribed by the regulations" says.
