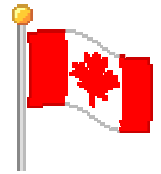

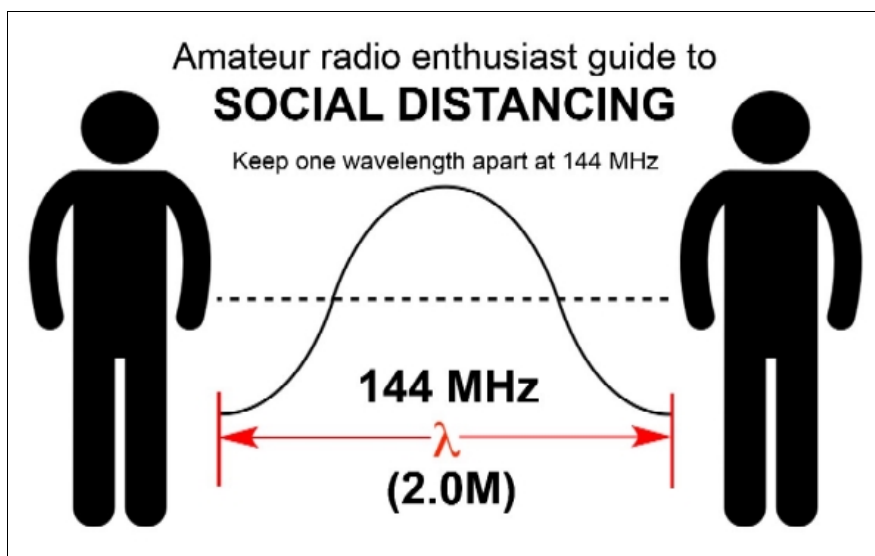

Get on the Air on World Amateur Radio Day” Special Event: Saturday, April 18

On Saturday, April 18, 2020 (1200Z to 2359Z), Radio Amateurs of Canada is organizing a special on-air event to celebrate World Amateur Radio Day.

Every year on April 18, Radio Amateurs worldwide take to the airwaves in celebration of Amateur Radio and to commemorate the formation of the International Amateur Radio Union (IARU) on April 18, 1925.

World Amateur Radio Day is the day when IARU Member-Societies can show our capabilities to the public and promote global friendship among Amateurs worldwide.

The theme of World Amateur Radio Day (WARD) is “Celebrating Amateur Radio’s contribution to Society” and this is especially relevant given the important role Amateur Radio will play as the current global crisis unfolds.

IARU President Tim Ellam, VE6SH, provided the following message:

“As I write this the world is in the midst of battling the COVID-19 crisis. A few short weeks ago many of us could not imagine the levels of isolation that we are now dealing with and the sacrifices of many on the frontlines of the pandemic. As we have done in past challenges to our society, Amateur Radio will play a key part in keeping people connected and assisting those who need support.

Having come off my own 14-day isolation after returning from an overseas trip, I am touched by the kindness of strangers who assisted me when I was unable to leave my house. It strikes me Amateur Radio opera-

tors, who give so much during these times of crisis, are not limited to assisting over the air. Amateurs are true volunteers and I would encourage everyone to assist in the community as they are able to.

My wish for this World Amateur Radio Day is for everyone to stay safe, follow the advice of medical professionals and use Amateur Radio and your skills to help us through this crisis.”

Radio Amateurs of Canada has decided to hold a new “Get on the Air on World Amateur Radio Day” special event in which we encourage as many Amateurs as possible to get on the air and contact as many RAC stations as possible.

RAC official stations will operate across Canada from 1200Z to 2359Z on April 18. The RAC official station call signs are VA2RAC, VA3RAC, VE1RAC, VE4RAC, VE5RAC, VE6RAC, VE7RAC, VE8RAC, VE9RAC, VO1RAC, VO2RAC, VY0RAC, VY1RAC and VY2RAC.

Those contacting one or more of these stations will be eligible for a special commemorative certificate noting their participation in RAC’s Get on the Air on World Amateur Radio Day Event

Note: Starting at 1800Z, VA3RAC will be active in the Ontario QSO Party and will be sending the contest exchange. Stations contacting VA3RAC after 1800Z are encouraged to send their contest exchange in return (state/province/country or Ontario county).

I’ve also seen a number of proposals to modify the FD rules to allow for a different kind of operation. I appreciate that kind of thinking outside the box but I think it is misguided. Some countries around the world are now allowing Radio Amateurs to use special “STAYHOME” call sign suffixes.

Michael Shamash, VE2MXU, is using VC2STAYHOM to raise awareness for social distancing during the COVID-19 pandemic and global public health emergency. He is a member of Radio Amateurs of Canada and is based in Montreal.

“In Canada we are unfortunately limited to a 7-character prefix, hence the VC2STAYHOM without the last ‘E’. I would like to thank those at Innovation Science and Economic Development Canada (ISED) for expediting the process and allowing me to get this call sign up and running within a couple of days, without the traditional 60-day wait period.

I’m hoping that by using this call, I can help promote social distancing across the globe (or as far as my 100-watt rig will get me!) and remind people that we each have a role to play in helping contain the spread of this virus.

I will begin using the call on Monday, April 6, once the issued authority to use it begins, until the time it expires on Wednesday, May 6.

As a full-time undergraduate student in microbiology transitioning to Graduate studies in the fall, my schedule is quite busy over the next few weeks but I will try my best to get on the air and make contacts with those who would like this unique VC2 prefix and suffix in their logs!

I am usually most active on 20m and 40m, split between SSB and FT8.

Before the COVID-19 crisis arrived in Canada, we were already discussing its possible implications in classes. That’s when I came up with the idea to get a call sign set up, and with the recent ‘stay home’ and ‘shelter in place’ orders issued by many governments worldwide, the time felt right to do so, and it would give those who are stuck at home one more fun aspect of the hobby to work on!”

Michael will operate on HF Bands and QSL via Logbook of the World (LoTW).

In addition to Canada, Australia has permitted the Radio Amateur Society of Australia (RASA) to use the special call sign AX2020STAYHOME. At 14 characters, that may set a record for world’s longest call sign.

Here are some other special event call signs:

8A1STAYHOME: Indonesia

9K9STAYHOME: Kuwait Amateur Radio Society

A60STAYHOME: United Arab Emirates

HZ1STAYHOME: Saudi Amateur Radio Society

In addition, Turkey has permitted the use TC1STAYHOME as a special event call sign for the awareness of COVID-19 pandemic.

“For a couple of weeks; stay home, stay safe please. We’ll be on air between March 27 and May 25. Hope this threat leaves our World before the date ends.”

What are some of the proposals? The first one I noticed is a proposal to allow all Class D stations (home station with commercial power) to work other Class D stations for points. The FD rules do not currently allow this. Class E stations (home station with emergency power) are allowed to any class station. Obviously, this rule is to encourage people to develop emergency power capability (and use it) for their home station. This is perfectly aligned with the emcomm focus of Field Day.

Another proposal is to allow a “backyard operating” class, where you set up a portable station in your backyard. Of course, this is already allowed under the rules as a Class B station.

One of the more innovative ideas I’ve heard is to allow multiple stations (not colocated) to operate under one club callsign, coordinating their operation via the internet. This approach emulates a “normal” Class A FD op-

1. Welcome to the HARC monthly meeting for February 19, 2020: The meeting was called to order by President VA1CC, Brian at approximately 1910 hours.

2. Acceptance of the Agenda: A motion was made to accept the agenda by VE1MR Bill, seconded by VA1RST Roger, the motion passed.

3. Roll Call: 36 members and visitors were in attendance.

4. Report of any Silent Keys: VE1AI reported that Eric Dephart a past member of the Greenwood Club, now a VE3 had passed, call not available.

5. Approval of Minutes of January 2020 as printed in the Reflector: A motion was made by VE1QD Scott, seconded by Fred VE1FA, motion passed.

6. Correspondence:

Andy Filmore MP visited Field Day last June and sent a Certificate of Achievement for finishing 1st in Canada and 8th overall in our class for Field Day 2020.

Banks statements were received from Scotia Bank.

The current month QST magazine was received and is in the rack in the office.

7. President's Report: Approval and the order of a new 30 foot foldover tower for the satellite antennas that were at St Andrews is in the works. Delivery is expected by the end of March with installation to follow. There will also be an HF vertical antenna installed on the top of the tower.

The Cowie Hill repeater site will undergo some antenna replacement and additions this year. A larger building to house the equipment and a location closer to the tower is being investigated. Keep an eye on the Reflector and the HARC website for

other items.

The following have passed the Advanced Class exam this past education training period, Tim Delaney, Don Trotter, Greg Estabrooks, Gordon Young, Gary Bugden, Ray Armstrong, Ralph Rosere, David Lewis, Cam Farnell, and Fraser McDougall. A round of applause followed to celebrate and acknowledge their achievement!

There will be a Ham Breakfast this coming Saturday the 22nd at the Young Street Steak and Stein at 10 am. See you there. So far 14 have indicated they will attend.

The Hobby Show will be at Shearwater on the 18th and 19th of April, contact Craig VE1JMA.

There will be a Ham Radio demonstration here at Station 50 with the Girl Guides with Dick VE1AI, Fraser VE1WO and Scott VE1QD on February 22nd at 2 pm.

8. Treasurer's Report: The income from the period of January 1 to January 31 was in the amount of \$1373.84. Expenses for the same period came to \$135.52 for a net of \$1238.32. The opening balance was \$9221.99 and the closing balance for the period was \$10432. A motion was made by VE1MR Bill to accept the report. VE1YL Helen seconded the motion, motion carried.

The internet service has been upgraded to Eastlink high speed to accommodate the new remote.

4. **Other reports**

MMA (Maritime Museum of the Atlantic) VE1AI Dick reported that we are gearing up for Spring Break in March, watch your email for a sign up sheet QSL Bureau, make sure that your address is updated with the Club and Radio Industry of Canada. Remember to contribute \$ to be able to receive your cards. HATS There will be a newsletter in the Reflector. Gary Murphy VA1GGM was not present.

5. Neil VE1YZ gave a report on the area repeaters VE1PKT (1983) and VE1CDN (1985), linking operations and the tie to the NSARA repeaters. The influx of the Yaesu promoted Fusion products has had an impact on repeater activity.

6. Fred VE1FA shared information regarding an Islands on the Air event, IOTA International competition sponsored by the Radio Society of Great Britain, RSGB, coming up this July 22-23. In the past, the NS competition team has usually placed first in North America operating from Bon Portage. Though, due to rising fees, two other locations are being reviewed. The sites being considered are Long Island and Little Tancook Island at approximately 1/2 the cost. The participating operators share in the cost. The group arrives at the site usually 2 days in advance to get the equipment to the site, boat,

eration, while everyone is locked down at home. This is not allowed as a Class A station: "All equipment (including antennas) must lie within a circle whose diameter does not exceed 300 meters (1000 feet)." This is roughly equivalent to a group of Class D or E stations working together towards a common score. Why not just operate as independent Class D and E stations, which is more like a real emergency situation? Adapt and Innovate

Our local radio club is considering different ways to adapt, seeing this as a training and learning opportunity. We will probably encourage our members to get on the air individually, with emergency power. We will likely encourage members to work other members, providing some kind of incentive or award. So our FD may look more like a local operating event, in addition to working distant stations. VHF/UHF will probably play an important role so that we include Technician licensees. Not sure just yet.

We are all experiencing some serious challenges this year and Field Day is not going to be the same. I am a bit surprised that the first thought about Field Day is to change the rules to make it easier or somehow better. I think we just need to adapt and innovate within the existing format. Existing Field Day Rules have plenty of flexibility.

That's what I say. What do you think?

HATS NEWS: April 2020

The Halifax Auxiliary Telecommunications Service (HATS) is an operational vehicle through which HARC and DARC contribute to emergency telecommunications when a man-made or natural disaster strikes our community.
